#### **PHASE I**


- 11 listening groups of 5 14 people each






## THE BIGGER PICTURE

- Pandemic is revealing our values and the fault lines
- Can't be sure what is here to stay and what will "snap back to normal".
- Feels like a permanent seismic shift:
  - The inevitability and need for transformative change at every level and in every way.
- For our Indigenous communities this is just one more crisis in a context of crises.
- We are still in a liminal moment of uncertainty:
  - Lots of experience, some reflection, not sure what it means
- We have an opportunity to make things new frightening and exciting
- We adapted quickly and creatively and now we're fatigued

## IDENTITY & PURPOSE



Who we are? What we should be doing?

- The stories of who we are and what we're doing are changing
- Institutional church seems less important than the community of the church
- Affirmation of our Anglicanism: connections over multiple layers, cultures, languages and geographies
- Root our vision and strategy for the National Church in our ecclesiology

### **LEADERSHIP & STRUCTURES**



- Leadership REALLY matters Bishops more present new tools, guidance, setting a positive tone of nonanxiety, connectedness, compassion
- Structures and systems that facilitate relationships, are agile and redistribute/share resources called for at all levels of the church
- Hierarchy is being levelled (facilitated by internet)
- More emphasis on the importance and effectiveness of lay leadership
- Dispersed leadership is more possible
- Potential for cross-country collegiality

### SUSTAINABILITY



- UNIVERSAL CONCERNS OVER FINANCES
- CAPACITY/WILL TO PROVIDE SUPPORT BEYOND LOCAL
- PROPERTY NEEDS & BEST USE
- GOVERNANCE SYSTEMS
- ACCELERATION OF FRAGILE TO INSOLVENCY
- AGE OF CONGREGATIONS & RELUCTANCE TO GATHER

### SOCIAL JUSTICE & ADVOCACY

- Covid is exacerbating social distress in homes and communities
- Church is a valued partner by community agencies we can act quickly, come alongside people where they are – to show up
- Hunger among social service groups for the church speak out (improved social safety net, basic universal income, support for vulnerable segments of society, internet accessibility, racism)
- Dismantling white privilege in church structures/leadership is key
- Despite Covid challenges, there is Indigenous hopefulness for the self-determining Indigenous church and broad recognition by others that this must be accomplished
- Demands on clergy and volunteers to serve while effecting change
